WHEREAS, Kingsport Housing & Redevelopment Authority ("KHRA") pursuant to the provisions of Title 13, Chapter 20, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, as supplemented and amended, has the power and authority to administer redevelopment programs located within its statutory boundaries; and

WHEREAS, KHRA has prepared a document entitled "Redevelopment Plan for Identified Districts & Study Areas" in conformance with Title 13, Chapter 20, Part 2, Tennessee Code Annotated, as supplemented and amended which has been adopted by the City of Kingsport ("Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, as previously authorized by the Sullivan County Commission, KHRA conducted a public hearing on April 28, 2025, to determine the necessity for the adoption of Redevelopment Plan for the Downtown Kingsport Redevelopment District on behalf of Sullivan County which includes the use of tax increment financing for the Dobyns Taylor Warehouse Project Area; and

WHEREAS, the comments and findings of said public hearing, along with the Dobyns Taylor Warehouse Project proposal for the Downtown Kingsport Redevelopment District have been presented to the Sullivan County Commission; and

WHEREAS, KHRA and the City of Kingsport, Tennessee have recommended the adoption of the Redevelopment Plan for Downtown Kingsport Redevelopment District Dobyns Taylor Warehouse Project Area and have also recommended approval of the use of tax increment financing for a Project known as Dobyns Taylor Warehouse to be located within the Downtown Kingsport Redevelopment District Dobyns Taylor Warehouse Project Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Sullivan County Commission agrees:

A RESOLUTION OF THE SULLIVAN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO PROHIBIT THE LOCATION, CONSTRUCTION, OR OPERATION OF DATA MINING CENTERS WITHIN SULLIVAN COUNTY UNTIL PROPER PLANNING CODES ARE IN PLACE

WHEREAS, data mining and cryptocurrency-mining facilities require extraordinary levels of electrical power, often equivalent to the consumption of thousands of homes, placing strain on local utilities and potentially increasing costs to residential ratepayers; and

WHEREAS, such facilities generate significant continuous noise from industrial-grade cooling systems, fans, and compressors, which can negatively impact property values, public health, and the peaceful enjoyment of nearby communities; and

WHEREAS, data-mining facilities provide limited job creation, minimal economic impact compared to the infrastructure burden they impose, and do not align with the long-term economic development goals of Sullivan County; and

WHEREAS, several Tennessee counties and multiple jurisdictions nationwide have restricted or prohibited data-mining operations due to concerns over electrical grid strain, noise nuisances, fire hazards, and the lack of community benefit; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners has a responsibility to protect the health, safety, welfare, and property values of its citizens and to ensure responsible land-use planning that preserves the character of local rural and residential communities; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has received increasing interest from private entities seeking to establish data-mining or crypto-mining operations, making it necessary and appropriate to adopt proactive protections before such facilities attempt to locate within the County.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee:

SECTION 1.

Data-mining centers, including but not limited to cryptocurrency-mining operations, blockchain-computing centers, or any facility operating more than 2 megawatts of computing equipment, are hereby prohibited from locating, constructing, or operating in Sullivan County.

SECTION 2.

No county permits, zoning approvals, building approvals, utility extensions, or development agreements shall be issued for the purpose of establishing a data-mining center within Sullivan County. SECTION 3.

This prohibition shall not apply to standard commercial or industrial businesses that use data processing equipment for internal business operations; it applies only to high-intensity, third-party, revenue-generating data-mining or crypto-mining facilities.

SECTION 4.

If any portion of this Resolution is found invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining sections shall remain in full force and effect.

A RESOLUTION PRESERVING DEDICATED SPACE FOR SMALL BUSINESSES AND ENTREPRENEURS WITHIN THE BLOUNTVILLE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL CAMPUS

WHEREAS, Sullivan County acquired the former Blountville Elementary School Campus for renovation and reuse, creating an opportunity to repurpose the facility for public benefit; and

WHEREAS, small businesses and entrepreneurs represent a vital portion of Sullivan County's economy — with local data showing that nearly 10% of the Sullivan County workforce is engaged in entrepreneurial activity, and the region benefits from access to a labor pool of approximately 270,000 workers (NETWORKS Sullivan Partnership); and

WHEREAS, according to the U.S. Census Bureau, Sullivan County's median household income is \$56,802, per-capita income is \$34,466, and roughly 12.8% of residents live below the poverty line, demonstrating the importance of supporting small businesses that expand job opportunities and strengthen economic resilience; and

WHEREAS, providing affordable, flexible workspace helps emerging businesses overcome early barriers such as high overhead, lack of professional space, and limited access to shared resources; and

WHEREAS, transforming part of the Blountville Elementary School Campus into a Small Business and Entrepreneur Resource Center would promote job creation, encourage local business growth, support homegrown innovation, and align with Sullivan County's long-term economic objectives.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Sullivan County Commission that:

Sullivan County hereby designates and preserves no less than 100 square feet within the Blountville Elementary School Campus to serve as the small business and entrepreneur space, dedicated to supporting locally owned small businesses, start-ups, sole proprietors, makers, and entrepreneurs.
